11. 2007 Y Series, Unwooded Chardonnay, South Australia <i>Yalumba are Australia's oldest continuously family-run wine company, founded in 1849. They have made this wine from early picked fresh grapes to ensure a fresh and lively flavour. This unwooded Chardonnay is full of tropical flavours and really is a crisp food friendly wine. 15. 2007 Antinori, Tormaresca, Chardonnay Puglia IGT <i>From this world famous wine maker Tormaresca which is currently being run by the 26th successive generation of the Antinori family who first started wine making in 1385. This Chardonnay is aged for 3 months in French and Hungarian oak to produce a wine that is a full of flavour yet not too oaky.</i>			20.45
16. 2006 Crossroads, Gewurztraminer, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand <i>From the North Island's historic Hawkes Bay Region the destination series Gewurztraminer is off dry and is markedly different from more familiar Alsace styles.</i>			21.30
17. 2007 Pyramid Hill, Verdelho, Upper Hunter Valley, Australia <i>A refreshing change from ubiquitous Chardonnay. Ripe exotic fruit but lifted by hints of Lime and spice to produce a fragrant elegant wine.</i>			22.15
18. 2008 Lofthouse, Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, N Zealand <i>From the Wairau Valley Lofthouse Sauvignon has soft floral, nettle, gooseberry and vine tomato aromatics.</i>			22.50

23. 2006 Graziano, Chenin Blanc, Mendocino, California, USA <i>The Graziano family left the vineyards in Asti Italy and immigrated to California, where they established their first vineyard in Mendocino county. A long, cool fermentation in French burgundy oak barrels produced a wine with rich intense aromas and flavours of melons, mineral and tropical fruits. This is a full bodied wine with mouth watering acidity.</i>			31.70
24. 2005 Muddy Water, Chardonnay, New Zealand <i>Single estate wine, using only its own production, something of a rarity. Opulent, fleshy well balanced and layered with rich toasty oak, seductive silky rich fruit and vanilla cream on the palate.</i>			34.15
25. 2006 Pouilly Fuisse, Chardonnay - Vieilles Vignes, Maison Auvigue, Burgundy, France <i>Made from Vines of an impressive 60-65 years of age, With Creamy honeyed notes and a silky texture that coats the palate and create a harmonious wine that conveys all the refined values of a good Burgundy.</i>			35.65

<i>Made by Georges Duboeuf, who is often described as the King of Beaujolais, this single estate wine is made from the Gamay grape and is a deep, radiant, ruby colour. Intensely perfumed offering a whirl of richly concentrated jam-like fruits. Brouilly is at its best while in the fullness of youth.</i>					
42. 2004 Solar de Samaniego, Rioja Crianza, Tempranillo/Graciano, Spain			21.45		
<i>Rioja as you expect it! (and often don't get these days) Garnet in colour, presenting a blend of autumn fruit, Leather and Vanilla cream.</i>					
43. 2005 Gatekeeper, Shiraz, McLaren Vale, Australia			21.50		
<i>Deep red. Powerful blackberry and mocha aromas are highlighted by sweet, vanilla oak which is balanced with fresh acidity and fine grained oak with a sweet, gamy, forest floor, meaty-scented nose, liquorice and earth. It possesses an attractive texture, loads of fruit, and no hard edges.</i>					
44. 2005 Ruca Malen, Malbec, Argentina			22.00

45. 2006 Hawequas Du Toit, Cabernet Sauvignon/Franc, South Africa			22.85		
<i>A blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Shiraz – made by the Du Toit Family in vineyards at the foot of the picturesque Hawequa Mountain. A wine full of concentrated ripe fruit layered with spice and gently toasted oak.</i>					
46. 2005 Chateau La Courolle, Merlot/Cabernet Franc: Montagne St Emilion, Bordeaux, France			23.00		
<i>A supple, sappy, cherry-rich blend which coats the palate. Very keenly balanced, it has a sensuous silky texture.</i>					
47. 2006 Norton, Malbec Reserva, Mendoza, Argentina.			27.30		
<i>Powerful, rich, rounded and with great bottle-age, this wine takes some beating for its style. This wine is made in the Mendoza region where roughly three quarters of Argentina's finest wine are produced. A perfect partner to meats with rich sauces.</i>					
48. 2007 Vieilles Vignes, Fleurie, Marcel Joubert Beaujolais, France			27.50		
<i>Ripe and fruity, with a supple and elegant palate. Made from Vines of between 30 and 100 years old while yields are low which is unusual in Beaujolais and is better known for stretching production to the limit.</i>					
49. 2007 Eradus, Pinot Noir, N Zealand			28.45		
<i>Stunning Cherry & Raspberry Fruit but with a classic more Burgundian nose than is usual in New Zealand Pinot Noir – very elegant and classy.</i>					
50. 2002 Nelson's Estate, Shiraz, Paarl, South Africa			29.75		
<i>A deep red wine with complex aromas of menthol, iodine and blackberries. Punctuated by chocolate and all spice flavours. A soft but rich full bodied wine with a abv of 14.8%.</i>					
51. 2006 Edmeades, Zinfandel – California			30.75		
<i>The Edmeades (like many California Zinfandel which are also blended) has a small Amount of Grenache, Petit Syrah, Pinot Noir and Syrah. Cherry liqueur, ripe blackberry and blueberry with liquorice, coffee, dried fruit, vanilla and sweet spices. Smooth and warm this is a Zinfandel built for sipping in front of a fireplace.</i>					
52. 2005/06 Chateau Beauchene, Chateauneuf-du-Pape Grande Reserve, France			34.25		
<i>This is a hearty blend of 65% Old Vine Grenache of Vines up to 93 years old! 25% Syra and 10% Morvedre. Grown on terraced Vineyards with very sandy soil mixed with galets which are round pebbles</i>					
53. 2002/03 Vigneti Casterna, Amarone, Pasqua, Italy			34.30		
<i>This intense and concentrated wine is made from grapes dried to raisins in the region of Veneto around Verona in North East Italy. This is the wine that scored the most points amongst you – our customers at one of our frequent wine evenings here at The Anchor</i>					
54. 2001 Yanmah Ridge, Cabernet Sauvignon/Merlot, Manjimup, Western Australia			36.15		
<i>Yanamah Ridge lies in midst of the magnificent temperate rain forests in the South-West of West Australia. This wine is enhanced by a 40% addition of Merlot and 5% Cabernet Franc, is a mid garnet red showing minty and blackcurrant aromas with nuances of tobacco leaf. This wine would compliment game and red meat dishes.</i>					
55. 2004 Nuits St Georges Domaine de L'Arlot, Pinot Noir, France			39.15		
<i>This monopole (single wine maker) is a wonderful 1er cru located just north of Premeaux. The old vines produce a deeply coloured and aromatic wine, with hints of plums & chocolate. It has concentration and length with a meaty, silky texture.</i>					
56. 1998 Château Franc-Maillet, Pomerol - Cabernet Sauvignon: Bordeaux			40.00		
<i>Good deep colour, quite extracted in style but plenty of fruit. Palate supple and full with lush notes of over ripe fruit</i>					
57. 2005 Quinta do Vale Donna Maria, Douro, Portugal			43.30		
<i>A bright blend displaying bitter sweet chocolate smooth tannin. This is a lovely wine combining the richness with a wonderfully feminine, perfumed freshness.</i>					
58. 2002 The Anvil, Redbank, Shiraz, Heathcote, Victoria, Australia			50.45		
<i>Produced in tough climatic conditions in and around the Heathcote region, recent prolonged drought and severe frosts have tested the resolve of the grape grower. However, low rainfall, warm days and cool nights provide ideal conditions for ripening the Shiraz fruit. An outstanding wine the 2002 shiraz has peppery floral, blackberry, cassis and cigar smoke scented aromas. A medium to full bodied shiraz with silky tannin, nicely integrated oak and a long finish.</i>

<i>Deliciously sweet dessert wine with a creamy texture and flavours of apricot, orange marmalade, honey and ginger.</i>

<i>The powerful and expressive nose shows aromas of white flowers, peach and honey. On the palate the wine is round and sweet, but not cloying, with a lively acidity.</i>	
Chateau Septy, Monbazillac, Dordogne, France 2003	50ml Glass £3.75
<i>Château Septy's Monbazillac has a rich peach, pear, honey and apricot nose with citrus acidity on the palate. Enjoy it with fresh fruit dessert or mature cheeses.</i>	
Avarus, T Rodriguez, Muscat De Frontignan, Charlemagne, France 2004	50ml Glass £3.95
<i>Honeyed citrus and passion fruit flavours course through this golden dessert wine.</i>	
Lilly Pilly Noble Blend, Riverina Region, Australia 2006	50ml Glass £4.75
<i>35% Semillon, 25% Sauvignon Blanc, 30% Riesling, Chardonnay 10% Even at 10 per cent, chardonnay definitely builds complexity in the wine, adding stone fruit characters to the bouquet and an extra dimension to palate texture. The aromatic varieties give a real lift to the bouquet, and there is plenty of zestiness and freshness on the palate.</i>
